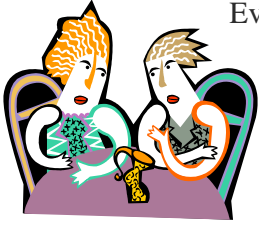
Nothing happens quickly but you can see what is possible with the new play area.
