NEWS FROM THE VILLAGE HALL.

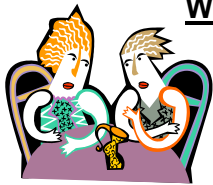

W.R.V.S BENEVOLENT TRUST

We have received a letter about the Women's Royal Voluntary Service Benevolent Trust enclosing an article about the Trust which is for the benefit of people who are, or have been WVS or WRVS volunteers.

The **WRVS Benevolent Trust** is for the benefit of people who are, or who have been WVS or WRVS volunteers By giving one off grants to help with everyday life.

Gill Galloway from King's Lynn is one of nine Trustees who administer the Trust and she is keen to encourage

past and present members of the WRVS to apply for assistance

The Trust helps past and present volunteers who find themselves in need of financial assistance due to an urgent need or crisis. The only requirements are that you have volunteered for WVS/ WRVS and on a fairly limited income. People can apply directly for grants or they can ask a family member or friend to make the application for them, So if you know of a family member or neighbour who would benefit from a grant and you know they have volunteered for WVS or WRVS at any time, please send in an application.

The Trust generally makes one off payments, however an applicant may apply again in future years if they have additional needs.

Examples of grants that we have given out recently include: Washing Machines, Cookers, Contribution towards roof repairs, Dental treatment, Spectacles, help towards the cost of an electric wheelchair, also towards the cost of a stair lift.

The grant will cover the costs of the installation for electrical or white goods and the removal of the old equipment.

To apply for a grant for yourself or on behalf of someone else please contact: The Hon. Secretary, WRVS Benevolent Trust, 14 Wykeham Rd, Guilford, Surrey, GU1 2SE.

You will be sent a form which is simple to complete and all the information you provide will be held in strict confidence.

We only ask for the most essential information to enable us to assess each application together with two quotations for the items you are asking us to fund. The trustees meet three times a year; however we consider applications throughout the year as they are received, so we are able to respond quickly.
